## Footnotes

1/ Under the Budget Control Act, mandatory programs subject to sequestration receive an automatic reduction of -6.6% in FY 2018, -6.2% in FY 2019, and -5.9% in FY 2020. On this table, the cuts apply to Special Milk (Child Nutrition), PSSF, SSBG, Vocational Rehabilitation, and a portion of highway funding exempt from obligation limitation.

- 2/ **DOT**: Figures include appropriations from the general fund.
- 3/ DHS: SHSGP excludes Operation Stonegarden and other set-asides, and UASI excludes non-profit security grants.
- 4/ HHS discretionary: Community Health Centers includes both mandatory and discretionary funds; the mandatory portion is subject to a special sequester cut of -2%. Due to reauthorization timing issues, the cut has not applied in recent years. The president's budget proposes to reauthorize the mandatory funding, which expires at the end of FY 2019, but Congress has not yet acted (the House bill assumes reauthorization). FY 2019, PB 2020, and House FY 2020 funding for Maternal & Child Health Block Grant includes \$23 million for new State Maternal Health Innovation Grants.
- 5/ **DOL**: Data reflect program years rather than fiscal years. Dislocated Worker Assistance and Adult Training receive an advanced appropriation. Unemployment Insurance amount includes Reemployment Services and Integrity funding.
- 6/ HHS mandatory: HHS mandatory: TANF and Child Care Entitlements are extended through June 30, 2019; the president proposes to reauthorize, but Congress has yet to act. PSSF and Independent Living figures include both mandatory and discretionary funds. The president proposes a \$295 million increase in Child Care Entitlements to States (matching grants) and a new, one-time \$1 billion fund for competitive grants. PB 2020 reflects the president's numerous legislative proposals (-\$7.8 billion in Medicaid and -\$1.6 billion in
- 7/ **USDA**: Within the Commodity Assistance Program, the president proposes to eliminate the Commodity Supplemental Food Program and the Farmers' Market Nutrition Program. PB 2020 reflects the president's legislative proposals (\$7 million for SNAP State Administration and \$454 million for Child Nutrition).
- 8/ HUD: Community Development Block Grant funding excludes disaster relief funds. Housing for Persons with Disabilities includes \$30.2 million in FY 2019 for Olmstead decision compliance.
- 9/ ED: The following programs receive an advanced appropriation: Title I Education for the Disadvantaged, Supporting Effective Instruction, Special Education, Career and Technical Education.
- 10/ EPA: Figures do not reflect rescissions.
