Footnotes

1/ Under the Budget Control Act, mandatory programs subject to sequestration received an automatic adjustment of -6.2% in FY 2019, -5.9% in FY 2020, and -5.7% in FY 2021. On this table, the cuts apply to Special Milk (Child Nutrition), PSSF, SSBG, Vocational Rehabilitation, and a portion of highway funding exempt from obligation limitation.

- $\ensuremath{\text{2}}\xspace/\ensuremath{\text{\textbf{DOT}}}\xspace$: Figures include appropriations from the general fund in FYs 2019 and 2020.
- 3/ **DHS**: SHSGP and UASI are net of set-asides, but SHSGP figure includes the tribal portion for FY 2019 and FY 2020. For FY 2021, the president proposes a new \$407 million competitive grant program that is not reflected in the table.
- 4/ HHS discretionary: Community Health Centers includes both mandatory and discretionary funds. The FY 2020 budget extends mandatory funds through May 22, 2020; figures reflect annualized funding level. The president's FY 2021 budget proposes to extend mandatory funding through FY 2021. For FY 2021, refugee assistance excludes \$200 million in mandatory funds for a new contingency fund.
- 5/ **DOL**: Data reflect program years rather than fiscal years. Dislocated Worker Assistance and Adult Training receive an advanced appropriation. Unemployment Insurance amount includes Reemployment Services and Integrity funding.
- 6/ HHS mandatory: The FY 2020 budget extends TANF and Child Care Entitlements through May 22, 2020; figures reflect the annualized funding level. The president's FY 2021 budget reauthorizes these programs and, for Child Care Entitlements, includes an additional \$1 billion in one-time competitive grants to increase the supply of child care and an additional \$295 million for child care to offset proposed TANF/SSBG reductions. PSSF and Independent Living figures include both mandatory and discretionary funds. The FY 2020 budget includes \$500 million in one-time formula funds for transition activities related to the Family First Prevention Services Act.
- 7/ HUD: Community Development Block Grant funding excludes disaster relief. The FY 2021 budget zeroes out the Public Housing Capital Fund and transfers its balances to a renamed Public Housing Fund distributed through the operating fund formula. In addition, totals for Public Housing Operating Fund and Tenant-Based Rental Assistance include funds (\$672 million and \$4.513 billion) for a new demonstration program called Moving to Work.
- 8/ EPA: FY 2019 and FY 2021 figures reflect rescissions; no rescissions were included in the enacted FY 2020 budget.
- 9/ ED: The following programs receive an advanced appropriation: Title I Education for the Disadvantaged, Supporting Effective Instruction, Special Education, Career and Technical Education. For FY 2021, the budget proposes to merge several education programs into a block grant.
