APPROPRIATIONS UPDATE

Remaining Spending Bills Could be Consolidated into Single Package

House and Senate appropriation conferees are expected to meet this week to approve a conference report that includes six of the seven remaining FY 2010 appropriations bills: Commerce/Justice, Financial Services, Labor/Health and Human Services/Education, Military Construction, Foreign Operations, and Transportation/Housing and Urban Development. The defense spending bill would be considered separately and used as a vehicle for other legislative priorities. A continuing resolution is currently funding programs included in these spending bills at last year's levels through December 18, 2009.

ED Proposes Priorities and Requirements for EMHE Grant Program

1) ACF Releases Guidance on Funding Termination for CSBG Grantees

On December 4, 2009, the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) released Information Memorandum No. 116 to provide guidance to states on corrective action, termination or reduction of funding for eligible entities under the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG). On November 27, 2009, the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) released Information Memorandum Transmittal No. LIHEAP-AT-2010-2 regarding a survey on the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). ACF is collecting information from grantees to include in its LIHEAP Report to Congress for FY 2009. States must complete the survey by December 15, 2009.

Housing Trust Fund Allocation Formula Proposed

On December 2, 2009, the Department of Housing and Urban Development released a proposed rule in the *Federal Register* outlining the formula for distributing housing trust funds — established in the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008 — to states. 1) YouthBuild Clarification

2) WIRED Report Released

On December 2, 2009, the Department of Labor released an evaluation of the \$15 million in competitive grants awarded to 13 regions in early 2006. The grantees, referred to as the Generation I WIRED regions, were facing challenges from global competition and changing economic conditions. The grants were intended to bring together regional industry, education, philanthropic, workforce, and economic development organizations in order to work towards economic stability and workforce growth. 1) DOE and USDA Announce \$600 Million Investment in Advanced Biorefinery Projects

On December 4, 2009, the Department of Energy (DOE) and the Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced that 19 biorefinery projects — in 15 states — will receive up to \$564 million in ARRA funding, while another will receive a loan guarantee for up to \$55 million. 2) DOE Announces \$3 Billion Investment for Carbon Capture and Sequestration

On December 4, 2009, DOE announced the selection of three new projects with a value of \$3.2 billion to accelerate the development of advanced coal technologies with carbon capture and storage at commercial-scale. An investment of up to \$979 million, including funds from ARRA, will be leveraged by more than \$2.2 billion in private capital cost share as part of the third round of the department's Clean Coal Power Initiative (CCPI). 1) Guidance on Amendments Affecting UI Modernization 'Compelling Family Reasons' Provided

On November 30, 2009, the Department of Labor released Unemployment Insurance Program Letter (UIPL) 14-09, Change 3, advising states on an amendment in the Worker, Homeownership, and Business Assistance Act of 2009 (P.L. 11-92) that allows state flexibility in expanding compelling family reasons for separation from employment to include escape from sexual assault, in qualifying for the two-thirds unemployment insurance modernization incentive payments.
